## **Participant Privacy Notice**

The purposes of the data processing	The information you provide to Sunderland CLLD Programme will be shared with the Department for Work & Pensions (DWP) and used to evaluate this project and to report to the ESIF Committee and / or European Social Fund for monitoring purposes, in line with European Commission regulatory requirements.
	Your information will also be shared with research organisations working on behalf of the Department for Work & Pensions who may contact you to discuss your involvement in the project for research purposes. Participation in research is voluntary and you will be asked to consent before taking part in any research activity you may be contacted about.
	The DWP may also link your personal details to official administrative records in order to monitor your employment status before your ESF support began and 6 to 12 months after you left. This information may also be shared with research organisations working on behalf of the DWP however individuals will <b>not</b> be identifiable and you will <b>not</b> be contacted about this research.
	Data will <b>not</b> be used or shared for any commercial or marketing purposes.
	At all times your information will be kept securely, and nobody will have access to it that shouldn't.
The lawful basis for the processing	For the purposes of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), the DWP is the data controller in respect to information processed which relates to all participation in the European Social Fund. ESF grant beneficiary organisations are data processors in respect to information processed which relates to participants in the operations and projects funded by the European Social Fund.
	DWP is <b>not</b> the controller for any other / additional data collected by the Sunderland CLLD Programme that is not essential for delivering the ESF programme, or for any personal data that would normally be collected anyway by the Sunderland CLLD Programme.

The retention periods for the personal data	The ESF Programme Action Note 018/18 sets out the lawful basis for processing personal data under ESF. All personal data held by DWP or research contractors <b>for the purposes of</b> <b>evaluation</b> will be permanently deleted no more than six months after the research has been completed (i.e. when the final report is published on GOV.UK).
