Free school meals

Children may be able to receive free school meals if their parent(s)/carer(s) are in receipt of a qualifying benefit. If parent(s)/carer(s) are unsure of eligibility, they can call 0191 561 1417 or email freeschoolmeals(qtogetherforchildren.org.uk and one of the team will try to help.

Free Healthy Start Voucher - help to buy food and milk

If a resident is more than 10 weeks pregnant or has a child under four years old, they may be entitled to get help to buy healthy food and milk. They may be able to receive free vouchers or payments to spend on cow's milk, fruit, vegetables, and infant formula milk, as well as free vitamins, if they are in receipt of a qualifying benefit.

To check if they are eligible, residents can contact the Healthy Start helpline on 0345 607 6823 and an application form can be sent out in the post. Residents can also ask a midwife or health visitor for an application form.

Crisis Support Scheme

The scheme can help residents who are unable to meet their immediate short-term needs either in an emergency, or because of a disaster, and where no other appropriate support is available. Help is provided mainly for food and fuel.

- Help with food may be provided to people in crisis who cannot access local foodbanks for specified reasons
- Help with fuel is for people in crisis who have prepayment meters (to avoid the chance of self-disconnection)

Community Care Support Scheme

This scheme is primarily intended to help vulnerable individuals/families to:

- Enter or re-enter the community, and/or
- Develop or maintain their independence within the community by contributing towards the cost of the key household items needed when setting up home

Help is normally provided by a contribution towards the costs of essential household items such as beds, furniture, white goods, and small household items.

Sunderland City Council Discretionary Housing Payments (DHP)

If residents have a shortfall in their rent and receive Housing Benefit or Universal Credit with Housing Costs, they might qualify for a DHP. DHPs are meant to provide short term financial help to enable residents improve their financial, or employment circumstances or look for cheaper alternative accommodation.
