#### Free school meals

Children may be able to receive free school meals if their parent(s)/carer(s) are in receipt of a qualifying benefit.

If parent(s)/carer(s) are unsure of eligibility, they can call 0191 561 1417 or email freeschoolmeals(qtogetherforchildren.org.uk and one of the team will try to help.

#### Free Healthy Start Voucher - help to buy food and milk

If a resident is more than 10 weeks pregnant or has a child under four years old, they may be entitled to get help to buy healthy food and milk. They may be able to receive free vouchers or payments to spend on cow's milk, fruit, vegetables, and infant formula milk, as well as free vitamins, if they are in receipt of a qualifying benefit.

To check if they are eligible, residents can contact the Healthy Start helpline  $0345\,607\,6823$  and an application form can be sent out in the post. Residents can also ask a midwife or health visitor for an application form.
