

Bus Service Improvement Plan (BSIP) A690 Durham Road Scheme Engagement



What is BSIP?

The Bus Service Improvement Plan (BSIP) is a government funded initiative to implement a wide range of significant proposed improvements to various aspects of bus services. These improvements will be delivered through the North East Enhanced Partnership, a formal partnership of the North East Combined Authority, bus operators, local authorities and Nexus.

Sunderland Council have been successful in securing the funding, via a finance bid to demonstrate the continuous commitment to the improvement of promoting alternative modes of sustainable transport.

This includes setting out ambitious targets to:

- reduce bus journey times;
- ensure services run on time;
- return to pre-pandemic patronage by 2025;
- increase passenger satisfaction; and
- aim for all buses to be zero emission by 2030

The proposal will provide Busses; cycles; taxis and goods vehicles over 3.5 Tonnes with a priority lane along the corridor into the city centre.

The works include converting existing no car lanes into bus lanes (with some exceptions).

Cameras will be installed for enforcement of the bus lanes and road markings will be amended to support the legal order. New traffic signs will be provided along the route to offer clarity for motorists..

A new signalised pedestrian crossing will be constructed outside of Bede college Campus and Sunderland Children's Centre to improve safety for both staff and visitors to both. This will involve amending the alignment of the carriageway and existing traffic island.






Existing

It is proposed to upgrade the existing pedestrian crossing facility, to include a new staggered, traffic signal controlled crossing for improved road safety for staff and students on this desire line at the entrance to Sunderland College, Bede Campus.

There will be a priority lane for buses and other authorised vehicles along this stretch and in addition, it is proposed to remove the existing pedestrian crossing island outside of the entrance to Sunderland Children's centre / nursery and replace it with a controlled zebra crossing. This will give pedestrians and visitors priority to cross the carriageway safely in this busy location.


